AWESOME WORK Ollie!

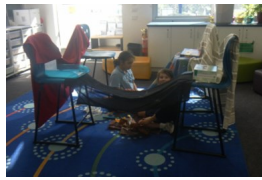
Week 4. Wattles Classroom 5/6-Archer
