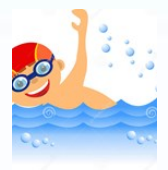

It shows great maturity. Well done, Matilda.

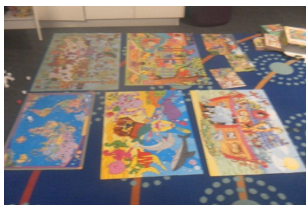
Week 7 5/6 Wattles Classroom— Bryce
