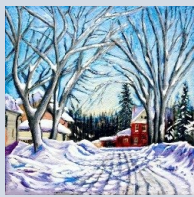

- Tee Times**
A multi Tee start will commence from 10 am. Players must report to the pro shop 15 minutes before tee time and be prepared to hit off when called upon.
- Rules**
The event will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, together with such local rules that are in force at the time of the competition. Disputes shall be decided by the Event Committee, whose decision shall be final. Any such dispute must be made in writing no later than 10 minutes after completion of play.
- Caddies**
All players up to at least age eight, must have an adult accompany them on the course to supervise and assist with transporting clubs
- Players without handicaps** are also able to have a caddy assist them on the course. The Club will also provide support individuals to each non handicap group as required.
- Weather Conditions**
The event committee may in the event of bad weather, or any other reason shorten the event or postpone to another day.
- Code of Conduct**
All players, officials, spectators and parents/carers of children playing are required to behave in accordance with Golf Australia Code of Conduct.
- Dress Code**
Belvoir Park requires players and spectators to be in neat casual clothing. No offensive or statements.
