

This fortnight in SEL (Social & Emotional Learning) lessons, students have been learning about identity and stereotyping. Students have been identifying the different aspects that make up who they are (their identity) and how these are similar and different to their classmates, such as their family, physical attributes, likes/dislikes and personal strengths. This has then led into discussions around stereotyping. We have been having some great discussions around how people can be 'pigeonholed' into particular categories based on how they look or their backgrounds, and how whilst these are aspects within our identity, they do not determine a person's identity as a whole.

What is stereotyping? (an excerpt from RRRR)

"A stereotype is when people assume that everyone in a certain group should be the same. A stereotype is unfair because it doesn't show that people are different and have choices even though they may also have similarities. Often, stereotypes can be a bit mean or judgemental because they lead to people having a set idea about what a person is, should or can be like, and this leads to the wrong conclusions.... A stereotype puts people in boxes that may not fit them. Some examples include that all people of a particular skin colour must be the same, or that all people of a certain gender must be the same... stereotypes are unfair and unhelpful because they can work to shut down people's freedom to choose for themselves about who they want to be within their own lives."

OSHC

This week in OSHC, we have been practicing the skills we need for our performance. We have also made cubby houses using



the different fabrics and we have built cars using the lego bricks. We have played games of Trivial Pursuit and completed jigsaw puzzles. Mindfulness colouring has been our art activity.

Outside, we have been playing down ball, practicing our hula hoop and skipping in the undercover area, and when the weather has permitted we have practiced footy skills on the oval.
